11b But they are shepherds who have
no understanding;
they have all turned to their own way,
each to his own gain, one and all.

12 “Come,” they say, “let me get wine;
let us fill ourselves with strong drink;
and tomorrow will be like this day,
great beyond measure.” **Isaiah 56:11-12**
